### Potato cyst nematode baseline survey progress

PCN baseline study which is funded by FAO through Technical cooperation program fund is on-going and is being implemented by a consortium of experts under the umbrella of NPCK. The analysis of the samples collected has been completed and the results will be released soon. The capacity building, awareness creation and Counties action plan on PCN championed by teams from KALRO, KEPHIS, MoALF and NPCK has been completed in 20 potato producing Counties. The mapping of the areas with PCN will also be done by end of December 2016.
